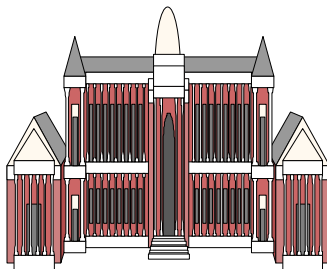

I realize we do not have
but a few weeks remaining but I
would like to re-visit our cell
phone policy. There has been
some misunderstanding by
some of our parents about our
policy.

Our cell phone policy
found in the Argyle ISD Policy
Manual states that students are
prohibited from using any type
of telecommunication device
such as, but not limited to, cell
phones, pagers, e-mail
communication devices or
similar devices during school
hours except with permission
from school administration or in
a life-threatening emergency.
**Possession is permitted as
long as the device is not
visible and is turned off.** The
penalty for violating this policy
is as follows:

1st Offense: the device
shall be removed from the
student's possession. A parent
or guardian may take possession
of the device from the principal
or designee at the conclusion of
the school day.

2nd Offense: the device
shall be removed from the
student's possession. A parent
or guardian may take possession
of the device after a meeting
with the principal or designee
and paying an administration
fee of \$15.

3rd Offense: shall be
considered consistent
misbehavior and shall be treated
as such under the Student Code
of Conduct.

A student is in violation
of this policy if they are
speaking to or text messaging
anyone on their cell phone

We are heading into the hot summer months when the bugs start flying and crawling. It is important to remember the rules to healthy outdoor time in the summer.

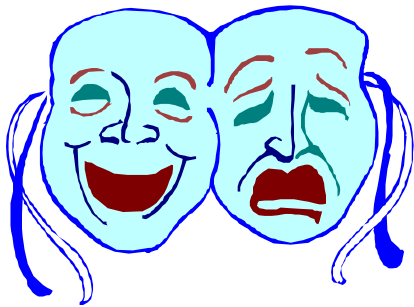
Ticks can lead to Lyme's disease and mosquitoes can cause West Nile Virus. It is important to remove standing water, use insect repellent, and avoid exposure with proper clothing.

We also need to remember that sun exposure poses a skin cancer threat. Application of sun screen before exposure will limit the danger.

The State of Texas issued new immunization guidelines last year that schools are required to observe. A student may no longer be enrolled in a Texas public school without proper immunizations. The old 30 day grace period of provisional enrollment is not longer a possibility. It is the parent's responsibility to obtain the necessary immunizations in order to attend school. Please be sure your students are up to date before we begin school in August.

The new guidelines have added some age groups to the Hepatitis B and Varicella vaccines that have not previously been required. You may be receiving notice that your student requires another immunization that you thought they did not need. Please realize this is State of Texas regulation and that school nurses have been given the role of enforcing and maintaining those regulations. It is extremely helpful if you take care of these needs as soon as you are aware of them. If you have questions, please feel free to call your school nurse.
