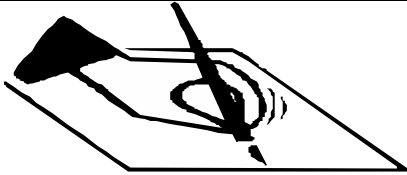

On Tuesday, April 25th, I presented a summary of the recent TASA facility study to a group of interested citizens. A question and answer period followed. Over one hundred people attended. Since this is a very busy time of year for many people and because the district's goal is to communicate this report to as many people as possible, I am holding another meeting on Wednesday, May 17th, in the high school cafeteria at 7:00 p.m. The same information will be presented, but people who attended last time are welcome to come again.

The entire power point of the report submitted by Dr. Trautman, TASA consultant, is also on the district web site. Go to www.argyleisd.com and pull down the tab "administration" to the facility study.

Late in May, all interested citizens will be invited to form a facility study committee. The purpose of the committee will

be to study data, assist in developing a long range master facility plan and advise the Board about when, or if, future bond elections should be called. This is your opportunity to study, learn and provide ideas in order to help the district determine its future direction.

The district is proud to announce the opening of our new tennis courts. They will be open for community use except during regular school hours when use is reserved for students. Please help us keep this facility in good condition. There must be no skates, skateboards, bicycles or any other type of vehicle used on the courts. Such use would quickly damage the courts and would be cost prohibitive to repair at this time. It is impossible for us to monitor the courts at all times. If you observe a violation of these rules, please ask the offender to leave and/or contact the Argyle Policy Department.

Early voting is now in progress for school board and town council. Election day is May 13, 2006. Don't forget to come by the administration building at 800 Eagle Drive, and Town Hall, to cast your vote. The close numbers in the March primary elections demonstrate

that every person's vote does count.

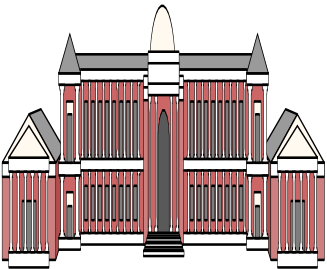
