

## **Dress Code for Formal Dances including Homecoming and Prom**

1. No midriff should be visible for any students, male or female. The midriff is defined as the mid-region of the human torso, including the front, back, and sides.
2. No low-cut garments that expose cleavage (female students) or the chest (male students).
3. All garments for male and female students must be no higher than three inches above the kneecap, including slits and kick pleats.
4. Mesh, lace, or any other "see-through" material does not count as coverage for the required areas specified in the code.
5. Strapless dresses, strapped dresses, and halter-tops must be properly fitted and may not be cut lower than the bottom of the shoulder blades in the back.
6. Trousers must be neat, clean, and properly fitted, and must not expose the underpants. No saggy or baggy pants are permitted.
7. All male students are required to wear a collared, buttoned up shirt during the event. The shirt may not be removed and may not be unbuttoned more than two buttons from the collar.
8. If a student or parent has a question as to whether a low-cut garment exposes cleavage or is too low-cut in the back, then the student and/or parent is responsible for obtaining "pre-approval" from a same gender staff member appointed by the campus principal. Pictures of garments on models are not acceptable for "pre-approval." The appointed same gender staff member must observe the student wearing the garment in person prior to the event to obtain the "pre-approval."
9. The campus principal or designee has the final authority to determine whether grooming or attire is appropriate for the event.
